

Personal, Social, Health, Citizenship and Economic Education (PSHCEE)

Key Stage 4 Curriculum Overview

PSHCEE is taught solely through a mixture of Form Time and the provision of enrichment sessions, when the normal lesson timetable is suspended, these take place throughout the year. Enrichment sessions are delivered by a mixture of school staff as well as external agencies. All of these sessions are carefully planned to meet the needs of our students and inform them of important topics in an age appropriate way.

The specific workshops differ slightly every year due to internal staffing and external workshop providers. The planned content is reviewed each year and adjusted to meet school aims as well as government guidance. Below is the planned content for 2019-20:

Year 10

- Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE) and grooming, focusing on recognising the signs and where to get help.
- Healthy and unhealthy relationships with a specific focus on recognising the signs of grooming within a relationship and how to get help for yourself or someone you know.
- Knife crime rates, the law and where to go for help.
- Mental Health awareness, including coping strategies, the importance of a healthy lifestyle and types of disorders.
- Finance education including pay slips, tax and pensions.
- CPR and basic first aid
- Pregnancy choices including abortion, adoption and teenage parenting.
- Different types of marriage
- Radicalisation and extremism
- Internet safety
- Liberties and freedoms in the UK
- Human rights
- Types of Government
- Voting in elections

- Mental Health including self-esteem and exam stress.
- LGBT rights and discrimination.
- Voting in elections
- Local and national governance
